In the Chicago Standard we find these excellent directions:

"It is not without excellent reason that so few good things come to us as soon as they are sought; even of the things which are intended for us, and in the order of Providence will in due time come. Among the profitable disciplines wisely appointed to us, the discipline of waiting is by no means the least. That in us which it is intended to master and control—the eager desire of possession—is dangerous, of itself, of its very nature, and needs to be kept under vigorous curb, lest it carry us to the harshest extremes where all things go to task. Could we not each exerted, for the very moment, a certain discipline of waiting, of desire, when a permission privilege might not serve? So, God is ever waiting."

The Bible speaks often of this. The act of the soul's relation to God, to which the most precious promises are given, is termed "waiting on the Lord"; and while this, no doubt, is very much a form of expression used to denote what is meant elsewhere by seeking the Lord, it still implies along with the seeking, the waiting. If we wait on the Lord, we are told, He will strengthen our heart; the discipline of the waiting, He strengthens. We summon the heart's deeper forces to withstand the impulses of impatience, and on the heat strength we have come to Christ's side, and in exercise grow stronger. David's happy experience in his "waiting patiently on the Lord": It was then said of thus that the "new song" came into his mouth, and he found himself able to testify so unshakably, "Blessed is the man that maketh the Lord his trust."

These things we must do; labor and wait, pray and wait, hope and wait. Then, while the blessing tarries, and we wait for it, we are preparing to use the better when it comes. For of discipline comes wisdom, and Patience our sister to Discretion.

Christ's compassion.

Perhaps there is no more really comforting thought in relation to Christ's compassionate love, than it was discriminative. "Christ loved men in the mass," said the preacher this morning; "but He also loved men as individuals."

We have numerous illustrations of this discriminating regard. Among them all, none is so sweetly tender as that of the widow of Nain. Christ was upon the highway, accompanied by many followers. He met another company, and their strand was evident. They were going to a burial. It was not an unusual thing to meet such a scene.

Yet to our Saviour it was an unusual case, common as it might have seemed to all about Him. Here was a woman following a loved one to the grave, and this was sad indeed, and in a general way was sufficient to call forth sympathy. But it was worse than this. "She wept." She had followed a bereaved heart. She had wept for her companion; now, also! she must weep for her sole support—her only son; and that was wedded of all.

It was, indeed, a case where discriminating comfort would not fail of impressing kind endeavor. The great hand of God went out in tender compassion. His Divine power found manifestation in the command "Arise!" And the sorrowing mother found a Friend, when least she expected one. A Helper whom no human kin help was no longer possible. What a joy was here! How she must have gone back rejoicing, who had come from her home in tears!

It is even with the needy, whose faith is strong, as it was with the widow of Nain; Christ will not fail in his discriminating compassion. On the highway of life His saints men and women meet. He and others ages ago, and known their particular want. We like to believe that our blind Bartimaeus called out to Him from the roadside, and said, "Lord, have mercy on me." And He, having mercy on me, said, "Go, thy sins are forgiven." And not simply an end of the cause removed, volving another need. To the blind of today He will say still, and He will not fail. Knowing His will not fail to help, the needy shall get from His hands, who now sleep on the way.
