Traits of Mountain Goats

Mountain goats are shy. They are intelligent. They live and thrive in a region where domestic goats would starve. Their hair is long course, uneven, and yellowish white. They are large animals. I saw severel that dressed large animals. I saw several that dressed over two hundred pounds. Their sharp, black home are slender, and curved alightly backward. They habitually walk, nin, play, and graze on paths and precipitious mountain slopes over which a dog cannot follow them, try he ever so hard. They are absolutely surefooted. The howeling about 10 their hoofs are hard. They are absolutely surefooted. The hornlike shell of their hoofs pro-The hornlike shell of their hoofs projects about a quarter of an inch beyond the pad of their feet. This pad is elastic, rubber-like, and roughened, to enable the goats to press it firmly against the rooks they travel over. The whole hoof is slightly pliable, and it spreads and fits tightly on to the surface it strikes, and it never slips.

Mountain goats are game animals. They will carry off large quantities of lead if it is not properly placed. To kill and to secure the game when dead is the most

it is not properly placed. To kill and to secure the game when dead is the most arduous hunting I have ever engaged in. In late autumn, when the snow that falls in the main cascade range has covered the herbage on which the goats feed, the beautiful animals slowly retreat before the white mantle till they are forced to enter the Chelan Mountains, where the snowfall is much lighter than in the main range, and they nass the winter on the snowfall is much lighter than in the main range, and they pass the winter on the rugged highlands that encompass the never-frozen lake. When they flist arrive at the Cheland highlands on their annual migration, they affect the crest of the ridges and play and feed at the base of the saw teeth, that are so clearly accentuated against the sky, and which appear so small when seen from the lake shore, and which are really so large that shore, and which are really so large that they impress you as lofty mountains when you climb to their bases and then gaze upward.—[New York Times.

When the difficulty of shaving the head is borne in mind, the true strangeness of the custom becomes doubly apparent. It is hard to see the advantage of it, yet in one form or another, and at one time or other, it has been practised in nearly every country.—[Yankee Blade.
