He may, if the bill be comes a law, whenever in his diacre tion it is necessary to keep out con tagious or infectious diseases, not only suspend immigration for any period not to exceed one year, but he can also suspend the importation of merchandise from infected countries. The authority to take possession of State property when it becomes necessary to use the same for quarantine purposes, without the consent of the State authorities, gives the National government all the power it could exercise under a power it could exercise under s National quarantine law.
