Of the three great islands of the Ma'ay Peninsula, as a big game resort, Sumatra is said to be the best, Bornco the worst. In Sumatra all the great mammalian varieties are to be found, the tiger, the elephant, rhinoceros, tapir, orang-outang, siamang, &c.; in Java, the elephant, tapir, and orang outang are represented. In Berneo, all these large animals are unknown now, though doubtless they existed there in former days. Sumatra offers less inducements to the general order of visitors than the other two mentioned above, for several reasons. The climate is worse, venomous snakes more numerous, and the greater part of the island, which is still unopened up, is occupied by Batak tribes who do not encourage strangers.

Monkeys abound in endless variety in all these islands, but especially in Borneo. The most remarkable birds were the hornbills, peacocks, pigeons of various kinds, and a very handsome pheasant, also several water birds, waders, and lovely kingtishers. There are said to be no less than 240 species of land birds known to inhabit this isle of Java, while at least forty are neculiar to it. On the other hand, no less than sixteen generally found in the adjacent islands are absent from this one. Rhinoceros, leopards, wild dogs, and their smaller game are to be met with, and deer are abundant, but where are no autolone or goals.
