Artificial Gum Arabic.

The decline in the supply of gum arabic, and the consequent increase in price of the product has led to the manufacture of an artificial substitute. Ten kilograms of husked oil are boiled with 80 kilograms of sulphuric acid and 100 liters of water, for three or four hours. The liquid is then filtered and four times its volume of alcohol is added. The precipitate is collected, washed and dried. The product is amorphous, colorless, and insipid, and gives, when mixed with water, a thick and effective mucilage.
