Twenty thousand men in New York with no grievance against their employers are about to throw themselves out of employment because they sympathize with some other men who have struck. We believe there is no record of a sympathetic strike having succeeded. It would be more practical for the sympathizers to stay at work and aid the strikers with a part of their wages.

The oil regions of western New York and Pennsylvania continue to furnish a pretty large percentage of the exportations of the country. The fiscal year, which is to end 90 days hence, will probably show exportations of oil amounting to nearly \$40,-000,000 in value, and footing up considerably more than 500,000,000 gallons of mineral oil from these two states. The year just about to end will round up a 20 years' record of exportation of mineral oils which will be interesting in its showing. In 1863 the exportation of illuminating mineral oil amounted to 23,220,-417 gallons of mineral oil, valued at \$7,469,795. Last year the total was 564,896,658 gallons, valued at \$33,-541,224, while in the preceding year the value of the oil exported was over \$40,000,000. The total exportations of illuminating oil for the period which will end with June 30 of the present year will aggregate in round numbers \$1,000,000,000.

The United States Patent Office records of last year show that over 400 applications were filed by women, their inventions ranging from buttonhole flowerholders to valuable devices for railway construction. A great deal of their inventive genius was devoted to the convenience and comfort of the sterner sex, resulting in improved suspenders, self-attaching neckties and other reliefs from the annoxances encountered more particularly by the bachelors of the land, and which are justly looked upon as a punishment for their perverse adherence to a life of single blessedness. "The mania for committing suicide is spreading to an alarming extent," remarked a professor at Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, Md., a few days since. "I recall reading a prediction," he continued, "that between the years 1885 and 1895 such an epidemic, if you can call it that, would prevail, owing to the plane tary influences, and the facts seem to hear it out, whether the prediction was based on suppositious grounds or as a result of astronomical research. History tells us that at an early period in France so prevalent was the idea of self-destruction that the Government issued a decree that after a certain time the body of any man or woman guilty of taking his or her life should be hanged in a public place and designated as that of a cowardly criminal. The result of the edict was that thereafter the suicidal mania became unfashionable, and deaths from this cause were few and far between. It would appear to me, reviewing the history of the last few years, that some legislation of the same sort must be enacted in America.
