The Legislature has made the 27th of April, the day of the Columbian naval pageant in New York harbor, a legal holiday throughout the state.

The bill to abolish capital punishment in this state passed the Assembly by a vote of 78 to 30. It failed in the Senate however, by a vote of 24 to 8.

Europe will this summer miss anywhere from \$50,000,000 to \$100,000,000 that American tourists annually spend over there during the war season. It is enough to paralyze trade in all that little corner of the earth. The tide will for once set the other way if cholera does not spoil all, and we shall see how it goes to take in \$50,000,000 of money in a summer from foreign tourists.

## THE NEW ROAD LAW.

The road bill which recently became a law authorizes the majority of any board of supervisors to adopt the county road system. Under this system certain portions of the public highways are to be designated by the board as county roads, and are to be maintained at the expense of the county. The amount to be expended upon them is to be appropriated annually by the board, and is to be used under the supervision of a county engineer to be appointed by that body. The supervisors may designate the portion of the annual appropriation to be expended upon any portion of the county roads, and "shall from year to year make such apportionment, so far as practicable, in such a manner that the amount expended in each town shall be proportionate to the equalized valuation of the real property of such town."

The law permits counties to issue bonds to raise money for the maintenance of county roads, provided they run for no more than 20 years, draw interest at the rate of not more than 5 per cent., and are sold at par. County roads are to be exempted from the jurisdiction of town highway officers, and the working out of road taxes is abolished on all roads of a county in which the county system has been adopted.

The powers conferred upon boards of supervisors is discretionary, and the system may not be put into practical operation at once. There is little doubt, however, that out of the 60 counties in this state, there will be found a few to give the system a practical test, and if the workings of the plan are found successful, the system will doubtless soon be generally adopted.

It may safely be said that the era of better roads is dawning.

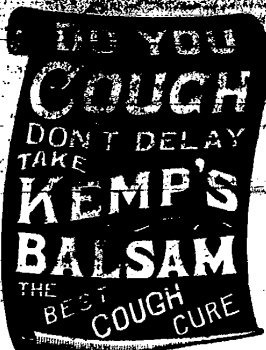
