Mrs. E. R. Leonard was called to Hornellsville last week on account of the serious illness of her brother, H. C. Ferry.

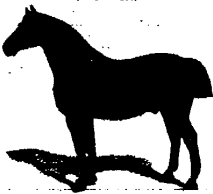
Mrs. Geo. Dayton who has been in feeble health for a long time is again confined to her bed.
