The Wide Tire Law.

Following is the text of the bill pro-viding for the use of wide tired wagons, which is now a law-Section 1. The highway law is here-

by amended by asserting after section 73 a new section to be known as 74, to take effect immediately.

"\$74. Rebate of tax for using wagon tires of certain width,—Every person who, during the year ending June 1, 1893, and each succeeding year thereafter, uses on the public highways of this State only wagons or vehicles with wheels, upon which two or more horses are used, the tires of which shall not be less than three and one-half inches in width, shall receive a rebate of one-half of his assessed highway tax for each such year, not exceeding, however, in any one year the sam of four dollars or four days' labor. The right to such rebate shall not be affected by the use upon the public highways of buggies, carriages or platform spring wagons carrying a weight not exceeding 1000 pounds. Upon making an affidavit showing that he has complied with the

provisions of this section during any America's Switserland—Cheap Excursion
Portage. period he shall be credited by the overer of highways of the road district in where he is assessed, with such rebate, Such affidavit may be taken before any overseer of highways, who is hereby authorized to administer such oath."

Wide tires is one of the first steps to-ward good roads, and they will probably come into general use before many years on wagons carrying heavy loads.


