Anything, therefore, which helps to solve the economic problems of the day is an ally of the temperance host. The W. C. T. U. gave practical recognition to this fact in the establishment of the relation of temperance to capital and labor.

Of the drink-made criminal it may be said, as good Bishop Myriel said of Jean Valjean: "This soul is full of darkness and sin is committed, but the guilty person is not the man who commits the sin, but he who produces the darkness." In dealing, then, with the question of "criminology," the point for the humanitarian—for every one who loves his fellow man—to consider is, who produces the darkness?
