At the Senatorial Convention held in Olean Tuesday, F. W. Higgins of Olean was nominated by acclamation for State Senator. Oscar A. Fuller and F. B. Church, both of Wellsville, were nominated as delegates to the Constitutional Convention.

Postal cards have been in use hardly 23 years, and yet, according to the collectors, there are now 8,000 varieties of them—at least, one collection contains that many. This collection includes, however, various issues of the same denomination, and also cards issued for special occasions. There is a postal card society in this country which numbers 100 members.

There seems to be a general desire among the Republicans of western and central New York that Justice William Rumsey of Bath should enter the field for the nomination for Judge of the Court of Appeals. When asked if he was a candidate for the office, Justice Rumsey replied: "I shall make no contest for the nomination. If it is offered to me, however, I shall most certainly accept it." Justice Rumsey was the Republican candidate for the same place in 1888, and ran several thousand votes ahead of his ticket.
