As the weather grows cooler the situation in the Senate begins to develop heat. An explosion may occur at any time that will prove decidedly damaging to senatorial dignity.

It would be singular if the coal producers of the United States should find a profit in exporting a portion of their product to England; yet this may happen if the strike of the miners is not settled soon.

Merritt F. Smith of Greenwood was nominated for Member of Assembly at the Republican convention for the second district of Steuben county, held in Addison last Saturday. Mr. Smith is a thoroughly competent man, and his election will be pleasing to his hosts of friends throughout this section.

The Republican State Convention will be held at Syracuse on Friday of this week. The delegates from Allegany county are W. B. Coats, Wellsville, W. J. Glenn, Cuba, M. Burrows, Andover, Frank Bessett, Independence, Jas. Craig, Burns, J. E. Middaugh, Scio, W. R. Folsom, Friendship, and Clarence Ricker, New Hudson.

It is interesting to note the defense set up by Russell Sage and Congressman Breckinridge, two men of mature years, against whom women have brought damage suits of much the same character. Mr. Sage pleads the statute of limitations and Mr. Breckinridge asserts that he was led astray by a school girl. Both men have been successful, each in his own field of effort but each seems to have had his weak side. The bond of sympathy between them ought to be strong.

There now seems no probability that unconditional repeal of the Sherman silver law will be accomplished, it having been demonstrated almost to a certainty that the bill cannot pass the Senate. For the past few days it has been apparent that the best that can be done will be a compromise between the anti-silver and free-silver forces. It is claimed that President Cleveland will not consent to any sort of compromise, but the free silverites claim that he will be obliged to do so in order to get any legislation whatever on the financial question.

The Democrats of the 32d Senate District held their convention at Jamestown Tuesday and placed in nomination Urban Prescott of Machias, Cattaraugus County, for Senator. William Cranston of Genesee, Eldyn Reynolds of Belmont, Obed Edson of Sinclairville, Hiram Smith of Jamestown and the Hon. C. S. Cary of Olean were nominated for Constitution delegates. Another convention, attended by Republicans, Democrats and Populists, was held in Jamestown the same day, and Walter L. Sessions, Jr., was nominated as an independent candidate for State Senator.

The balance of trade is running in favor of the United States like a mill race; and if any foreigners who have loaned money in New York city are anxious for gold, they may secure it without the exportation of a dollar's worth of gold from this side of the Atlantic, unless they insist upon having it altogether and at once. Unless the foreigners sell American securities or withdraw loans, they will presently be compelled to send gold to the United States to pay their debts to this country; and the gold will come by reason of the balance of trade in favor of the United States, and not on account of high interest rates or a premium on currency.
