The wonderful strides the petroleum industry has taken since the first barrel of refined oil was offered for sale 30 years ago is illustrated by some figures which are found in a report recently made by the Pennsylvania State Bureau of Industrial Statistics. The exports of refined oil now-rank in value fourth on the list, being exceeded only by cotton, breadstuffs and provisions. For the year ending June 30, 1864, the total exports were 23,000,000 gallons, and in 1891 700,000,000 gallons. A larger percentage of the oil product of the country is sent abroad than of any other product except cotton. on in price has been re markable. What constitutes a conspiracy against the rights of the people under the laws of New York State was decided last week by the Court of Appeals. The Niagara County Court of Sessions convicted J. Carson Sheldon and four business associates of conspiracy in having formed a compact styled "The Lockmaintain the price of coal to consumers with the intent to restrict trade, in violation of the Penal Code of the State and of the laws of 1893 This case was the first prosecuted under this latter act, which Governor Flower signed on May 17 last. The defendants held that proof of an overt act was wanting beyond the mere formation of the coal exchange. The Court of Appeals decided against them, handing down a decision affirming the judgment of conviction rendered in the lower court.
