Miss Harriet Monroe, who wrote the World's Fair ode, has brought suit for \$25,000 damages against the New York World, which printed it in advance of the delivery, without authority, and also printed an alleged likeness and biography of Miss Monroe, each of which she considers ground for action in itself. One rather interesting thing in the case is Miss Monroe's allegation that after the copy had been stolen her agent warned the World against using it and received this reply: "We will take our chances on it. Explain to her that the World could not miss an opportunity to give to the public such a grand poem." By the premature publication the author lost her copyright and various opportunities to make money and reputation.

The fourth district of the town of Belmont, Franklin county, is perhaps the only district in this state where there will be no election. The district is located in the south part of the town, and its only inhabitants are contractors and wood choppers of the Chateaugay Ore and Iron Co. There were 34 voters there last year, but this fall the number is put at about 15. Among them all there are only two men that can write, and these do it slowly and clumsily. They were elected inspectors last spring, and they now refuse to qualify. Because of this refusal, and also because seven men able to read and write are necessary for the board, it is impossible to hold any election in the district.

Reports are in circulation to the effect that the supplies of petroleum in the United States are beginning to fail. For some time the Pennsylvania oil fields have fallen off in their production, and the older fields of Ohio are also said to be giving out, while new discoveries do not by any means balance the losses. In the old world the oil in Baku is largely taking the place of American oil, so that the exports from this side of the Atlantic may be expected to fall off. If the reports prove true the effect may be that the price of oil may advance here, but it can only be for a time, as there is little doubt that the oil fields of the Mackenzie river are the richest in the world, and if prices advance it will not be long before the prospectors will invade that section and have wells by the thousand.

Engineers are always, like the great Alexander, seeking new worlds to conquer. Mr. F. B. Behr, Associate of the Institution of Civil Engineers, finds steam locomotion on the surface of this planet too slow at a more or less dangerous maximum of sixty miles an hour, says the London Telegraph, and he proposes to whirl the man of the twentieth century at the rate of two miles per minute. Under the title of "Lightning Express Railway Service," he publishes a full statement of his plans, with all the necessary technical details. The motive power proposed is electricity, and the method that which is known as the Lartigue single-rail system, which, in a rudimentary form, is now at work on a short line of nine miles and a half from Listowell to Ballybunion, in Ireland; and from Feurs to Panissieres, in the Department of the Yonne, France. There are many advantages claimed for this idea, including the absolute impossibility of a train leaving the metals; its cheapness of construction, as well as the terrific speed.
