A meeting of the Allegany County Publishing Association, held at Hollivar, April 29, 1892, adopted the following resolutions: That the week beginning May 9, 1892, be set apart for resolutions of respect, and local notices of entertainments from which revenue is to be derived, shall be charged \$1.00 per line. That ordinary notices, except such as are published as a matter of news, and lists of weddings, shall be charged for as not less than ten cents per line.
