At a meeting of the Allegany County Publishers Association, held at Hollister, April 23, 1894, the following rules were unanimously adopted to take effect the week beginning May 9, 1894: RULE 1.—That not less than 5 cents per line be charged for resolutions of respect, and local notices of entertainments from which revenue is to be derived. RULE 2.—Cards of thanks to be charged \$1. RULE 3.—Obituary notices, except such as are published as a matter of news, and lists of wedding presents to be charged for at not less than 5 cents per line.

There is also a cooling room with a temperature some what higher than the cold storage, and somewhat lower than an ordinary room, in which the cheese will be placed for a short time before being put into the storage proper. The cooling room will hold about four thousand boxes of cheese. The cold storage is built on the most approved plan, and Messrs. Snyder & Clark will have the best of facilities for keeping cheese in a perfect state of preservation. The storage is now completed and a car load of ice will be placed in the same today.
