The Woman's Christian Temperance Union of Andover meets the first and third Thursday in each month.

Neal Dow at a recent celebration of his ninetieth birthday said: "When Christians say go and vote go, the liquor traffic will go."

It is a star of hope in the temperance sky, that thirty-nine out of our forty-five states have now made scientific temperance education mandatory in the common schools.

There are in the United States about five millions of church members who are voters. If they were to unite to make the liquor traffic an outlaw, there is no political party that they could not bring to terms.

Everybody seems to talk hard times, though we are in the land of plenty; and, from the present outlook, we have not seen the worst of it. There is no doubt that much of the want among the sufferers of this land might have been avoided by careful economizing.

I know a family which struggled hard to get through the past winter. Often the table was scantily spread, and hunger gnawed at the very vitals; and yet this family spent more for tobacco than for bread. The bread was not a necessity, the tobacco was.

Apropos of the recent adverse vote in the Constitutional Convention, on woman suffrage a correspondent writes: "Defeat! The idea is absurd. Put us back one year ago and it is easy to see that whatever the outcome of the Constitutional Convention vote, we have gained mightily. It is a simple example in arithmetic. Subtract woman suffrage in New York in the fall of 1893 from woman suffrage in New York in the fall of 1894. We have a remainder—what? The names and addresses of friends of the cause of every county, almost every township in the State, a large number of new political equality clubs, and an immeasurable gain in public sentiment. We have had a campaign which, in the opinion of an experienced leader, is the most educational one ever conducted. We have rolled up a monster petition indorsed by over 625,000 citizens. We have turned the Constitutional Convention into a woman suffrage meeting for four long evenings, and sixty loyal men have publicly identified themselves with our movement. Can this be called defeat?"

The head, tusks, teeth and one vertebra of a mastodon have just been found in a peat bog near Fredonia, New York. The great size of the head, five feet six inches across, indicates that the animal was one of the largest of its kind. The bones of the leg have not been found so it is impossible to judge accurately of the animal's height, but it is estimated at about eighteen feet.

The Friendship Miner will case is to be appealed to the court of appeals. The last decision, which was made by the General Term of the Supreme Court, affirmed Judge Norton's decision that the will should stand, giving the bulk of the property to Mr. Miner's adopted daughters. The present appeal is made by other relatives, who received very little from the large estate.

No. 6 of the Brazilian order of locomotives has just been turned out at the Brooks Works in Dunkirk. The big iron and steel mastodon is named the "Twenty-fourth of March," that being the date on which Brazilian rebels laid down their arms. Another to be built later will bear the name "Fourth of July" out of courtesy to the country in which it is to be constructed.
