Hon. Henry H. Faxon has issued a telling circular, showing the condition of Quincy, Mass., (a city without a saloon) over those where that evil industry is tolerated. During the twelve years since saloons were voted out, this town has grown in population eight per cent. and its property valuation has increased one hundred and twenty per cent. At the same time the cost of supporting the poor has decreased fifty-seven per cent. Could there be a more pointed argument in favor of saloon banishment?

Chicago's mayor, John P. Hopkins, has given cause for great rejoicing in ordering the city police to destroy all bill boards containing indecent posters. The night of Sept. 6th a large posse of police, armed with lanterns, axes, hatchets and other necessary tools, raided the entire line of an elevated railroad, and utterly demolished the sign boards along the route, committing to destruction the obscene advertising of theatres, variety shows and all manner of objectionable literature. Any one making an attempt to replace these signs will be arrested and prosecuted.

In a speech at Haddo House, Lord Aberdeen's Scotch home, he recently remarked that "woman had been put through a marvelous discipline during the long night of history to teach her the virtues of unselfishness, tenderness, patience, compassion and love, so that she might become the teacher of the world; and it was quite certain, by all the laws of science, and all the traditions of the world's past, that the great factor in the future evolution of society must be the ascent of woman."

NEAR-BY NEWS.

Belmont's gas supply was short last week. That's a good outlook for winter.

A Rushford firm has secured the contract for putting the heating apparatus into the new jail at Belmont.

Work has begun on the telephone line which will connect the towns "down the river" with the outside world.

Teachers' Institute for the Second Commissioner district of Allegany Co., will be held in Belmont, the week beginning Oct. 29.

The golden wedding of Rev. F. M. Alvord and wife of Friendship was celebrated last week. One hundred and fifty guests were present.

The Express of Buffalo proposes an electrical carnival for that city to celebrate the completion of the great Niagara Falls power scheme.

It is reported that the Zuni Medicine Company, which has been hiding out at Bolivar the past two weeks, carried \$2,000 out of that town. Who says it is hard times?

Mr. F. C. Keeney, who is now the owner of the Church estate at Belvidere, is the owner of 2,250 acres of land in this county, besides several hundred acres in Wyoming county.

A six inch line for conveying crude oil from East Notch near Richburg to Wellsville, is being laid by the Standard Oil Co. The new line is being laid to increase the capacity of the main line from Olean to Wellsville.

A novel sight was witnessed in Naples recently, when a dwelling house was moved through the street by two traction engines, tandem. It was taken along easily and at the rate of an ordinary walk or about two and one-half miles an hour.

Hornellsville residents will soon burn gas for fuel. It is manufactured in Canisteo from crude petroleum, and the pipes are now laid to Hornellsville's Main street. It is claimed the cost of this fuel will be much less than the people have paid for coal.

Postmaster H. E. Webster of Brockport, President Harrison's last appointment before going out of office, is found short in his account, and one of his bondsmen, H. E. Johnson has been appointed to conduct the office temporarily. The deficiency is large.

A serious accident occurred at Hume last Wednesday. Fred Relya, son of H. H. Relya, Esq., while undertaking to get upon his father's horse was thrown to the ground and kicked back of the car. His life was despaired of for a time, but he is now doing well and on the way to recovery.

The Christian Endeavor Society of Phillip's Creek held its regular meeting Sunday evening at the church, and just after the close of the exercises, Miss Aria Elliott stepped to the front outside door of the church to ask a question of some one who had stepped outside, and as she put her head outside of the door a shot struck her on the left side of the head, making a scalp wound about an inch in length. The wound bled profusely and the girl was very much frightened. There is perhaps no reason to suppose that the shot was fired at her but it is a very foolish, saucy piece of business, and it is said that the careless author of the trouble will be brought up to account for the matter, if found out. A Curiosity in Court.

By far the most interesting trial of the last county court was that of Polly Ann Camp, the "Gauger Giantess." Polly Ann was indicted by the grand jury for using profane and obscene language, and after a stormy trial was acquitted. The woman is a tower of strength, and despite her 54 years of age, is the very embodiment of alertness and agility. When asked what her means of support were, she testified that she plowed, dragged, drew logs, chopped wood, and in fact did a man's work at everything. She said that it was not unusual for her to cut from two and one-half to three cords of four-foot wood in a day. She is credited with being very handy with her fists, and, as the story goes, on one occasion when she was drawing logs in the woods in the winter time, she was accosted by three men, whereupon she attacked them, using either fist with great skill and effect. The three men were utterly unable to stand before her. Her manner during trial was at times bold and derisive; again she would become extremely meek, and once she even resorted to tears.
