Regulating the election of its directors and officers. (Published in compliance with Sec. 11, Chap. 687 of the 1892 Laws of New York.)

Art. I, Sec. 1. The Annual meeting of Stockholders shall be held on the third Wednesday of December in each year at the office of the Association, at 8 o'clock, p. m.

Art. II, Sec. 1. The right of any Stockholder to vote at any meeting of the Stockholders shall be governed and determined by Sections 20 and 21 of Chapter 687 of the Laws of 1892, of New York.

Art. III, Sec. 1. There shall be a Board of Directors, consisting of six (6) Stockholders, who shall be elected by ballot at the Annual Meeting of Stockholders, and who shall hold their respective offices for one year from the first day of April next ensuing, or until their successors are elected and qualified.

Art. III, Sec. 2. At any time not exceeding ten (10) days preceding the next ensuing election of Directors the President shall appoint two (2) Inspectors of Election who shall serve at the next ensuing election of Directors or until their successors are appointed and qualified, who shall discharge the duties required of them by statute.

Art. III, Sec. 3. A Bond-approving Committee of three (3) Stockholders, and an Auditing Committee of three (3) Stockholders, all preferably not Directors of the Association, shall be elected by the Stockholders, in any manner they may adopt, at the time of the election of Directors, members of which committees shall hold their respective offices for one year from April 1st, next ensuing, or until their successors are elected and qualified.
