Death of Alvin Richardson.
Alvin Richardson of Friendship died on Thursday, Nov. 22, 1894, at Ridgway, Orleans county, where he had been at the bedside of a dying sister. While there he contracted pneumonia, which caused his death in a few days.
In 1819 Alvin Richardson, the father of deceased, moved with his family from Otsego county to Richburg. It was in honor of him that the village was so named. He built the first grist mill and also the first saw mill established in the town of Wirt.
Alvin Richardson, Jr., was born in 1814. He was married in 1839 to Rebecca H. Gray of Franklin county, who died Jan. 17, 1891. They had five children: Mrs. Marion Davis now of Friendship, Mrs. Crandall Lester now of Richburg, J. Wallace Richardson of Andover, Wm. J. Richardson of Belmont, and Walter G. Richardson of Richburg.
In Jan. of 1892 Mr. Richardson was married to Mrs. Martha Farnham of Manchester, N. H., who survives him.
Mr. Richardson was for years a prominent citizen of Richburg, and was widely known throughout this county. A few years since he moved to Friendship.
The funeral services were held Monday at Friendship and the remains were taken to Richburg for burial.

At a meeting of the Allegany County Publishers Association, held at Bolivar, April 29, 1892, the following rules were unanimously adopted to take effect the week beginning May 9, 1892:
Rule 1. - That not less than 5 cents per line be charged for resolutions of respect, and local notices of an ornate nature from which revenue is to be derived.
Rule 2. - Cards of thanks to be charged \$1.
Rule 3. - Ordinary notices, except such as are published as a matter of news, and lists of wedding presents to be charged for at not less than 5 cents per line.
