

Death of M. A. Woodbury

M. A. Woodbury died suddenly at his home, Ord, Neb., on Thursday, Dec. 6th, 1894, of heart disease. His age was 42 years. Mr. Woodbury formerly lived in Greenwood, and later in Andover, leaving here a few years since to go to Nebraska. He was well known in this vicinity, and had hosts of warm friends here who were deeply shocked to learn of his death.
