Testotalism, the foundation stone of temperance reform, should be kept no less clearly in view than its superstructure, prohibition; not other wise can prohibition ever be "broadbased upon the people's will."

Give me the new times and the new times and the new man, for he is coming right along side by side with the 'new woman'-God bless her! and God bless him, too!
