No, my dear, thank God you live today and not a hundred years ago, and every new day will give you more and more cause for being thankful. It is a better time for every soul on earth, and this thing people call 'good old times' is a dreary humbug, that might better be decently interred and done with. Give me the new times and the new times and the new man, for he is coming right along side by side with the 'new woman'—God bless her!" and God bless him, too!

### NBAR-BY NEWS.

#### A Few Outside Happenings in Which Our Readers Will Be Interested.

Cuba's Fire Department is getting ready to hold a five days' fair.

Irving Reynolds, a fifteen year old lad whose home is at Rawson, this county, has disappeared and no trace of him can be found. He took \$57 of his father's money and some cheese checks with him.

A few days ago Sheriff Swift discovered evidences of what was doubtless a plot on the part of some of the prisoners to break jail. Several steel saws and other implements were found in the cells. The prisoners are there yet.

Riley Allen, of Allentown, N. Y., recently purchased a half-interest in 130 oil wells owned by C. F. Sternburg. Twenty-two of the wells are in the Pennsylvania district, and the remainder in Allegany county. Their monthly production is 2,250 barrels.

A Jamestown lad, five years old, who is ambitious to become a letter carrier, a short time ago secured a bundle of old love letters that his mother had treasured since her courtship days, and distributed them from house to house throughout the neighborhood.

The system of narrow gauge railroads that was so flourishing in the oil fields of Western New York and Pennsylvania several years ago is almost a thing of the past. The Kendall & Eldred railroad, one of the most flourishing of the system has just been discontinued.

Rev. Thomas Lynch, son of Mr. and Mrs. Patrick Lynch of Cuba, was recently ordained to the priesthood by the Rt. Rev. S. V. Ryan, bishop of the Buffalo diocese. Father Lynch officiated at his first mass in the Church of Our Lady of Angels at Cuba on Christmas day.

It is reported that preparations are being made to put down another test oil well near Belfast. The White Creek Oil Company do not appear to be satisfied with the results of their well recently drilled, and which proved to be a failure. They still believe that oil exists in that vicinity.

The bust of the late President Allen, of Alfred University, on which Miss Belle Carpenter has been at work much of the time for over a year, is nearly completed. It is of heroic size and is said to be a good likeness, and is considered by the teachers in the Sterner school as superior to anything ever sent out from the school.

A few days ago Robert Bates of Friendship was shot dead while hunting in the town of Clarksville. He was passing through a windfall, when in some manner the hammer of the gun caught in the brush, and the weapon was discharged, the shot striking Bates in the thigh, severing an artery and causing death within a few moments. He leaves a widow and three children.

The Allegany County G. A. R. Association met at Belmont Thursday and elected the following officers for the ensuing year: President, Robt. Seeley, Belfast; Vice President, Edward O'Malley, Cuba; 2d Vice President, Russell Tremain, Wellsville; Sec'y, R. H. Grady, Cuba; Treasurer, Thomas Tefft, Belmont; Chaplain, A. L. Halbert, Belmont; Officer of the Day, A. H. Waters, Belmont. John E. Midaugh was made president of the monument association.

The district convention of the Knights of Maccabees for the district comprising Steuben, Allegany and Wyoming counties, will be held in Hornellsville January 21st. There are in this district 66 tents containing about 4,000 members. Each tent will send one delegate to the convention and it is expected that a number of the Grand officers will be present. The object of the convention is to elect delegates to the State convention, which will be held in Jamestown in February.

That Hornellsville will get the proposed New York and Pennsylvania is doubtful. The business men of the city as a rule, are not giving the matter attention, and for that reason the company is not over anxious to build there. General Magee of the Fall Brook system has offered Messrs. Cobb and Rumsey, the principal shareholders in the new road, \$50,000, as a part compensation, if they will turn their road up Bennett's Creek and down Troup's Creek to Knoxville, Pa. Messrs. Cobb and Rumsey are holding out for \$100,000, but a prominent official said recently that if an offer of \$75,000 was made by General Magee, he would probably get the plum. Hornellsville is asked to subscribe \$50,000 to secure the road, but the money does not seem to be forthcoming.
