NEAR-BY NEWS.

A Few Outside Happenings in Which Our Readers Will Be Interested.

A Buffalo company is to establish a large manufactory of wall or plastering cement at Wayland, Steuben county.

Dr. Ryder, who was arrested at Hornellville some time ago on the charge of having murdered an infant child in Vermont, has just been acquitted.

The Hornellville Separate Company will soon take possession of the new armory. It is one of the finest structures of the kind in the state.

A Steuben county judge has sentenced Cortland Leach of Woodhull, to 100 days in the jail or to pay \$100 fine. Leach is a farmer, and several months ago clipped the ears of a horse because he was balky.

The formal opening of the Goodyear Road, the Genesee division of the Buffalo & Susquehanna, recently completed to Wellsville, took place on January 1st. Through trains are now running from Wellsville to Ansonia, Pa., where connection is made with the Fall Brook Railroad for Williamsport, Pa.

A boy was caught last week pouring kerosene oil over some of Elmira's fine asphalt pavements. The oil is very injurious to asphalt, causing it to soften. The boy was arrested. It is thought he was hired to do the deed by some one who is evidently not profiting by the success of this kind of pavement.

A Fredonia dispatch says: While Arthur and Thomas Woodman of Hamlet were hunting rabbits Friday in the woods near the Cattaraugus county line, a wildcat sprang from a tree upon the shoulders of Arthur, the younger brother, felling him to the ground. Thomas shot the catamount through the head. Arthur's face and neck were terribly lacerated. He will be disabled for life. The catamount weighed 50 pounds.

A sad accident occurred near the village of Campbell, Steuben county, last Thursday, in which a child was fatally burned. The wife of George Austin left her two small boys, aged 2 and 3 years, in the house while she went on an errand to a neighbor's across the road. On returning in a few minutes Mrs. Austin found the youngest child in the agonies of death and its clothes entirely burned from its body. The other child was but slightly burned. A few burned matches lying on the floor told the story.

John McKinch has been employed the past year on the farm of Henry Norton on Knights Creek in the town of Scio. He met with a peculiar accident about eight weeks ago; while driving a team the harness broke and threw the whinletree back with such force as to break his right leg just below the knee. A doctor was called and set the broken limb and it had improved so that Friday McKinch took off the bandages and attempted to use his leg a little. While sitting in a chair he in some way lost his balance and fell, again breaking his leg.

In a billiard room at Coudersport, Pa., on Tuesday evening of last week, a fatal quarrel took place between Julius Zimmerman and Andrew Stroup. They had been playing billiards, and Stroup called Zimmerman a foul name. Zimmerman raised his cue over Stroup's head, and after holding it there for a brief length of time, he brought it down with a crash. Stroup saw the blow coming and warded off some of its force with his own cue. There was force enough to it, however, to crush his skull, and the youth fell to the floor fatally hurt. He died last Friday and his assailant was arrested.

About thirty members of the Masonic order residing at Angelica, have applied to the Grand Lodge of New York for a dispensation to establish a lodge at that place. There was a lodge organized there about seventy years ago, which disbanded about the time of the Morgan excitement. And after these many years it will reorganize with good prospects of success. Col. Jas. Mapes a former resident of Belmont (now deceased) was a charter member of the old Angelica lodge and his son, B. P. Mapes, Esq., of Belmont, has in his possession a square and compass that was used by the craft at the time it was disbanded.

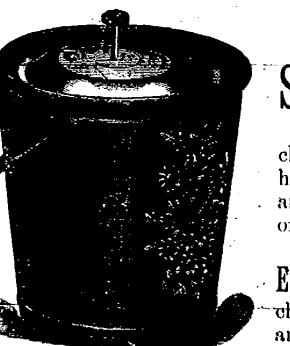
