At a meeting of the Allegany County Publishers' Association, held at Rollin, April 29, 1892, the following rules were unanimously adopted to take effect the week beginning May 9, 1892:
RULE 1.—That not less than 5 cents per line be charged for resolutions of respect, and local notices of entertainments from which revenue is to be derived.
RULE 2.—Cards of thanks to be charged \$1.
RULE 3.—Obituary notices, except such as are published as a matter of news, and lists of wedding presents to be charged for a not less than 5 cents per line.

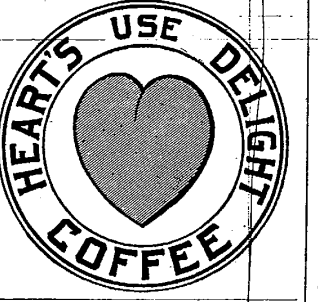
