Some curios experiments have lately been performed with a view to discov-ering the effect of electric light on vegetation. It has been found that a con tinuous electric light promotes the for mation of chlorophyll, which is the green essence of plants, occupying much the relative position with regard to vegetable life that blood does to animal life. The structure of the leaves also changes, the veins becoming straighter and less numerous...

Under a continuous electric light the distribution of the chlorophyll is more extended than under the influence of ordinary sunlight. The bark is less developed, and the tissue of the stem assumes a totally different appearance When the electric light is discontinued —as, for example, when turned on twelve hours out of the twenty-four— the effect on vegetation is intermediate between that of normal sunlight and that of continuous electric light. Alpine plants cultivated under a con tinuous electric light like very much like arctic plants, which are exposed to almost continuous sunlight in the

the cause of these changes is not known. It has only been determined that the changes do occur. The opinion is now generally entertained among scientific men that electricity is highly beneficial to vegetable life, and that the employment of electricity will be a most important factor in the agricul-ture of the future. ture of the future.

An Artificial Human Body.
Novelists have already made the public familiar with the idea of automatons turning into living beings, and doctors have of late made many clever transfers of blood and flesh and skin.
It appears that the work of mythe of the standard standard standard skin. It appears that the work of making an artificial human body can be carried on by purely mechanical means. A process has actually been patented in Germany for making a substitute for the natural skin for use in wounds. The muscular coating of the intestines of animals is divested of mucous membrane and then treated in a pepsin solution until the muscular fibers are half digested. After a second treatment with tannin and gallic acid a tissue is produced which can take the place of the natural skin, and which, when laid on the wound, is entirely absorbed during the healing process.
