The Woman's Christian Temperance Union of Andover meets the first and third Thursday in each month.

Three new red-letter days have been added to the W. C. T. U. calendar: Mothers' Day, Jan. 28, the birthday of Madame Willard; Teachers' Day, date to be decided later, and Woman's Sunday, the first Sunday in October. On this day it is planned to ask clergymen to preach on the ecclesiastical status of women, and to request a collection to be taken for the W. C. T. U.
