Rain Bains.

Mr. Chauncey M. Depew says: "Twenty-five years ago I knew every man, woman and child in Peekskill, and it has been a study with me to mark the boys who started in every grade of life with myself, to see what has become of them. I was up last fall and began to count them over, and it was an instructive exhibit. Some of them became clerks, merchants, manufacturers, lawyers, doctors. It is remarkable that every one of those that drank are dead; not one living of my age. Barring a few who were taken off by sickness, every one that proved a wreck and wrecked his family did it from rum, and no other cause. Of those who were church-going people, who were steady, industrious and hard working men, who were frugal and thrifty, every single one of them, without an exception, owns the house in which he lives, and has something laid by, the interest on which, with the house, would carry him through many a rainy day. When a man becomes debased with gambling, rum or drink, he doesn't care; all his finer feelings are crowded out."

The recent decision of the New York court ratifies the excise law and affects about 2,000 liquor saloons daily selling within 200 feet of churches or school houses in the city. That the excise commissioners are now two to one in favor of Sunday closing is another source of rejoicing for temperance people.

Two years ago the State of New York appointed a Board of Examiners, before whom all graduates of medicine must pass an examination for a license to practice in the State. This year they published the comparative standing of all the colleges of the State. The students of the Woman's Medical College of the New York Infirmary were found to have taken the highest average. So, for the present, the women students lead in the results of the examinations of the State Board. Henceforth, the professors of this woman's medical college can truthfully say that their college leads the State.

NEAR-BY NEWS.

A Few Outside Happenings in Which Our Readers Will Be Interested.

Alfred University will celebrate its 60th anniversary at its commencement in June.

The Silver Lake Quartette, which is well known throughout this section has disbanded.

The Rev. Dr. Herbert W. Knox of Auburn has accepted a call to the Presbyterian church at Belmont.

Mr. and Mrs. Norman Roblee of Canisteo, celebrated the sixtieth anniversary of their marriage recently.

Allegany county will receive \$40,144.81 school money this spring. The number of teachers in the county is 337.

E. H. Hough, publisher of the Hornellsville Herald, was found guilty of criminal libel last week at Corning, and was fined \$100.

The famous White fruit farm near Nunda, the peaches on which in a single year have been worth \$50,000, has been sold for \$14,000.

M. E. Horner, who was renominated for supervisor of Amity on the Republican ticket, has withdrawn and Dr. H. A. Barney has been substituted in his place.

The new Fitts opera house at Salamanca, valued at \$18,000, was burned Wednesday. This was the second destructive fire that occurred in that town last week.

Mrs. George Green left yesterday to join her husband at Mt. Clemens, Mich. They will return in two weeks. She was accompanied by her daughter Mary. -Belmont Dispatch.

It has been arranged to hold a farmers' institute at Friendship on March 4th and 5th, instead of the regular meeting of the county farmers' club. A corps of State instructors will be present.

Forest fires in Pennsylvania last year burned over 225,000 acres, causing a loss of fully \$1,000,000. Two men and five horses and cattle lost their lives in the fires. Much cut and sawed timber was also burned.

The N. Y. P. & O. railroad will be sold at auction at Akron, Ohio, on Tuesday. No bid of less than \$10,000,000 will be received. The sum of \$100,000 must be paid down to bind the bargain. The reorganized Erie will probably bid in the road.

A factory to manufacture artificial maple syrup is to be started in Clyde. Corn cobs are boiled and then white sugar is thrown into the mess. The stuff is said to resemble the real article so closely that only experts can detect the difference.

Papers have been served upon the treasurer of Steuben county enjoining him from paying the bridge claims recently allowed by the board of supervisors, pending a re-examination of the cases by the courts. The injunction was granted by Judge Davy of Rochester.

In 1892 a resident of Arcade, sunk a test well for oil, gas, salt or mineral water. At a depth of 2,400 feet gas was struck. The tools were sunk five feet deeper and a heavy flow of salt water followed. It is now proposed to case off the water and utilize the gas in lighting and heating the village.

The following officers were elected at the recent meeting of the Southern Allegany Teachers' Association: President, L. W. Craig, Wellsville; Vice-President, Albert Ball, Belmont; Recording Secretary, Miss Maria Allen, Alfred; Corresponding Secretary, T. H. Armstrong, Friendship; Treasurer, Frank Whitford, Nile.

The farmers of this State have perfected an organization to be known as the New York State Farmers' Congress. Its declared object is "to provide unity of action and concentration of efforts among the various farmers' organizations of the State." Annual meetings are to be held in Albany, each local organization being entitled to three delegates.

A house in Cuba owned by a man named Congdon and occupied by a family named Rumsey, was destroyed by fire Wednesday evening. A lighted lamp was left on the table, and a dog allowed to remain in the room. Mrs. Rumsey stepped out for a moment. Her absence caused the dog uneasiness, and in his efforts to seek egress he overturned the lamp and set fire to the house.
