### TOWN MEETING.

The Republicans Carried Everything in Andover—No License by 22.

The full Republican ticket was elected in Andover on Tuesday. Aside from the excise ticket, the principal strife was over the offices of Supervisor and Town Clerk, but, as will be seen by the figures below, Messrs. Boyd and Phillips received only about 20 votes less than the nominees for Inspectors of Election, the vote on the latter offices probably representing practically the party strength. We give the vote received by each candidate, the names under the title of each office being placed in the following order: Republican, Democratic, Prohibition.
