Alvah Richards died at the residence of James Williamson, Friday morning, Feb. 28, 1896, after a long and lingering feebleness of body and mind.

There survives him his wife and two daughters, Mrs. James Williamson and Mrs. Anson Brewster.

The funeral services were held at the house Sunday afternoon at half past one o'clock, attended by a large gathering of sympathizing friends and neighbors. Words were spoken from a text which he himself had selected long ago for that purpose: Matt. 3: 17—"And to a voice from heaven, saying, This is my beloved son, in whom I am well pleased." (W. B.)
