The Women's Christian Temperance Union of Andover meets the first and third Thursday in each month.

The number of W. C. T. U. women who recently waited on the mayor of Brooklyn, to urge the closing of saloons on Sunday, was about three hundred.

The editor of the Catholic News writes in one of his issues: "Many a pitiful story is brought out in the police courts of a great city. Perhaps one of the saddest the newspapers in New York have ever reported came from Jefferson Market Court last week. A poor mother dropped dead at the feet of the son who had been a disgrace to her. His son was a young man of thirty or so. Instead of helping his aged mother, he spent what little he earned in drink. At last the poor woman determined to have him committed as an habitual drunkard, hoping that such a step would be for his good. She was called to the witness stand to swear to the complaint, but the effort was too much for her, and she died with the words on her lips, 'It's breaking my heart.' Here is a temperance lecture more eloquent than any man ever delivered."

The Literary Digest of February 1 devotes three columns to "The search for the Presidential issue of 1896." Of eight leading journals quoted, but one seems to have any conception of a moral question as forming in any sense a political issue. The changes are rung again and again upon free trade, tariff and currency, but there is never a word about the injustice of purely masculine suffrage, nor the faintest intimation that the liquor traffic and its accompanying evil, intemperance, are present problems. If the women of the nation were recognized as a component part of our governmental life, the dominant issue of 1896 would not be far to seek.

The supreme court of Ohio affirmed the decision of the circuit court which declared constitutional the law extending school suffrage to women of that state. Thus step by step—here a little and there a little—the ever feminine draweth on.

The Loyal Legion Temperance Society of New York city, Mrs. Frances Barnes, president, has issued its annual outline of its varied work for God and temperance. Parlor meetings have been held in large city homes. The reading rooms for street gamins is bountifully supplied and encouragingly patronized by homeless waifs. Summer excursions have been provided and fresh air homes enjoyed at the Newburgh-on-the-Hudson and the George Junior Republic, Freeville, N. Y. Wednesday evening lectures and Saturday evening entertainments have been conducted for the boys' pleasure. Mr. John D. Rockefeller, Mr. James Talcott and Mr. Cornelius Vanderbilt are the patrons of the society, which also numbers a large list of honorary and life members. The Young Women's Division, cr Y, is an effective right arm of the organization.
