Spain can't talk too cocky for those on this side who are anxious for a scrap with somebody.

Matters have reached the point where one or two war scares more or less make little difference either way.

Congress knows there is less danger at the polls, for its members, in resolutions against foreign governments than in domestic legislation.

Canada has granted but 116 divorces in the last 20 years. Canada can never hope to become annexed to the United States until she can show a better record than that.

Two members of a theatrical troupe fought what proved to be a genuine duel on the stage at Marion, Ind., a few days ago, and one of the parties was fatally wounded. Thus another means of gaining a livelihood is closed against the prize-fighters.

Two bank cashiers, at different points in the West, refused to throw up their hands at the command of robbers. They saved the bank's property, but lost their own lives. On the whole, the result is not calculated to encourage bank officials to be brave.

The Earl of Dunraven offers his yacht, the Valkyrie, for sale; price \$5,500. This includes, his agents say, "everything connected with the vessel." There are some things connected with the vessel that most sportsmen wouldn't want—Dunraven himself, for instance.

Mr. Fitzsimmons declares frankly that he does not wish to fight Mr. Corbett. And the public will have no difficulty in believing that what he says is true. Fitzsimmons is the latest convert to Washingtonism, and his statement quoted above indicates that he intends to stick to it, even at great sacrifice.

The bill which was introduced in the Legislature changing the time of holding town meetings from spring to fall has been killed, mainly through the efforts of Assemblyman Robbins, of this county. It transpires that the bill applied to only a few counties, but Mr. Robbins was fearful that its passage might be but the beginning of a general change in the time of holding town meetings, and he made an able argument against it. His action will be approved by his constituents.

The next electoral college will consist of 447 members, and the mathematician of the Rochester Post-Express thinks the Republican candidates will receive 227 votes; the Democratic candidates 89, viz: the votes of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, South Carolina, Texas and Virginia, leaving the following States "doubtful": California, Colorado, Delaware, Idaho, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Tennessee, Washington, Wyoming, West Virginia and Utah, whose votes foot up 131. It is probable that the doubtful States, as above given, will not be thus classed by all who may indulge in the pastime of counting electoral votes before they are cast.
