All friends of scientific temperance instruction in the public schools will be glad to learn that the opposers of the Ainsworth law in New York, led by Superintendent Skinner, have arrived at a compromise with its advocates. Every one will be glad to know this controversy is to end, especially as Dr. Charles L. Thompson, chairman of the church central committee, says that the new bill "sacrifices no principle of the original law, and at the same time meets the objections of the teachers, which were from a pedagogic standpoint." It fact, the compromise has made the law stronger because the penalty is stronger. The bill now stands nine chances out of ten of passing. Mrs. Mary T. Burt, W. C. U. President of New York, says: "The professional pride of the teacher was touched by the rigid provisions of the law, and we made all the concessions we possibly could. A similar spirit was manifested by the teachers." With the temperance and educational forces thus united, any attempt to repeal the law is not probable. The brewers, of course, still oppose it, but it is not likely that New York State will submit to their framing its educational laws. When the victory of a strong, comprehensive law, enlightening school boards and teachers in regard to their duties and with a penalty sufficient to compel its enforcement is secured in New York, the victory for similar legislation is practically won in all other States having weak scientific temperance laws.

"Let us thank God most of all that in the supreme court of public opinion the greatest lawsuit of the century is set for trial. Long quibbled over and frequently postponed, it has at last come squarely to the front; it heads the docket, and the clear-cut issue is stated in these words: 'The Women of the Nation versus the Liquor Traffic.'"

The Bishop of London, recently, in introducing the temperance delegation to the Prime Minister, pointed out that, whereas it takes one thousand people to support a baker's shop, and seven or eight hundred to maintain a butcher, both dealing in the necessities of life, there is in many parts of Great Britain a public house to every one hundred or one hundred and twenty inhabitants. This is a standing disgrace to the country.

NEAR-BY NEWS.

A Few Outside Happenings in Which Our Readers Will Be Interested.

Steuben county is one hundred years old, and proposes to celebrate the event this year.

A Rochester man, John C. Light, has obtained letters patent on a leather tire for bicycles, which he believes will revolutionize the bicycle business.

The kitchen of the Canisteo Baptist church, which is located in the basement of the church, was flooded with water last week, and a social had to be postponed.

The Hammondspont Wine Co., of Hammondspont, Steuben county, has made an assignment. This company has been in existence about 25 years, and was supposed to be in a flourishing condition.

Twenty thousand brook trout and ten thousand German trout arrived in Wellsville Monday from the state fish hatcheries at Caledonia and will be placed in the various tributaries to the Genesee river in the vicinity of Wellsville.

A new Episcopal church to cost about \$20,000 will be built in Wellsville. Half of the sum has been subscribed by two members of the congregation. The plans will be drawn by a New Jersey architect, and work upon the foundation will begin at the close of Lent.

A dispatch from Coudersport says that Julius Zimmerman pleaded guilty to manslaughter in the first degree and is awaiting sentence. It is thought he will receive about seven years in the penitentiary. He killed a young man named Stroup with a billiard cue, some time ago.

The residence of Wm. Kurtz, of Belmont, was burned to the ground last week Tuesday night. The fire started in a clothes room in the second story from a lamp being tipped over. There is practically no fire fighting apparatus in that town and all that could be done was to watch the house burn. At the time of the fire Mrs. Kurtz was ill and was removed to a neighbors house.

The typhoid fever epidemic in Elmira does not abate. At a meeting of the Board of Health of that city, held last week Tuesday, a resolution was passed to the effect that the Elmira Water Company be required to supply pure water to its patrons, and a period of ten days was allowed for making preparations to comply with the terms of the resolution. Failure to do so is to be punished by a fine.

An old soldier living in Hornellsville whose pension was \$27 a month, has been notified that by an error he has been drawing an excess of pension for several years, and his pension had been reduced to \$17 a month. In order to recoup the pension would be stopped until it had caught up. The surplus was \$1,300 and he will have to go without an income for seven years to make it up. His name is E. Webb, and it is said he will now probably have to go to the poorhouse.

Mrs. Deborah Haynes Doty of Frewsburg, Chautauque county, celebrated her 100th birthday a few days ago. The event was practically turned into an old folks' reunion. About 200 persons were in attendance. Mrs. Doty is as spry as she was at 50, and is in the best of health. She has lived in Frewsburg for nearly half a century. During the afternoon a literary program was rendered after which a bounteous dinner was served. At the first sitting there were 48 of the oldest, and the total of whose ages was 4,464 years, making an average of 93 years. One table with Mrs. Doty at the head and surrounded by 20 of her juniors, made a total of 2,027, or an average of a little over 96 years.

Lewis Cass of Albany has been appointed counsel to the New York State Veterinary Medical Society, and will bring actions in various counties of the State, against over one hundred persons who are charged with the illegal practice of veterinary medicine in violation of law. The penalty for each day of illegal practice is \$50. Besides there is a fine of \$250, or imprisonment for six months for the first offence in a criminal proceeding; and a fine or imprisonment for second offence. The law passed last year provides that every one who practices veterinary medicine after the passage of the act, who is not regularly licensed to practice under that law should be liable to prosecution by the veterinary medical societies of the several counties in the name of the people.
