as Thirty Feet of Good Sand and is Goo for Ten Barrels a Day Without Be-ing Shot=Great Hustle for Leases.

J. Apgar's well on P. McLaughlin's farm, lot 25. Andover (South Hill) was drilled to the third salid hast cotorday. As soon as the sand was reached work vas stopped and Mr. Apgar was noti fied. He at once came on and the first of this week the drill was sent down There are about thirty feet of good oil producing sand in the well, and before being shot the well is good for ten barrels of oil every 24 hours. We hear that the well is to be shot this week, although we have not been able to trace the report to an authoritive source. A shot would undoubtedly increase the production coniderably.

The completion of this well has great ly increased the strife for leases in this vicinity, and every acre of land that can be secured, not only in the vicinity of South Hill, but throughout the whole town, is being rapidly taken. In some leases. C. B. Lever received \$80 for a lease of a portion of his farm in the north-east portion of this town. Par-ties have also been trying to secure leases all through the northernly part of the town, and, in fact, in almost any direction where there is a possibility of obtaining them.
