OIL AT SOUTH HILL.

THE AEGAR WELL ON SOUTH HILL FINISHED.
It Has Thirty Feet of Good Sand and is Good for Ten Barrels a Day Without Being Shot—Great Hustle for Leases.

J. Apgar's well on P. McLaughlin's farm, lot 25, Andover, (South Hill) was drilled to the third sand last Saturday. As soon as the sand was reached work was stopped and Mr. Apgar was notified. He at once came on and the first of this week the drill was sent down through the sand. There are about thirty feet of good oil producing sand in the well, and before being shot the well is good for ten barrels of oil every 24 hours. We hear that the well is to be shot this week, although we have not been able to trace the report to an authoritative source. A shot would undoubtedly increase the production considerably.

The completion of this well has greatly increased the strife for leases in this vicinity, and every acre of land that can be secured, not only in the vicinity of South Hill, but throughout the whole town, is being rapidly taken. In some cases cash bonuses are being paid for leases. C. B. Lever received \$80 for a lease of a portion of his farm in the north-east portion of this town. Parties have also been trying to secure leases all through the northern part of the town, and, in fact, in almost any direction where there is a possibility of obtaining them.

Intense interest will be felt for the next few days, as there are several wells nearly completed which will govern to a considerable extent the future action of oil men in this section. Among these wells are Phillips Bros' on the Macken farm, lot 92, Wellsville (South Hill), the North-east Oil Company's well on the O'Boyle farm, lot 113, Andover, (Shovel Hollow), and the Rock Oil Company's well on J. K. Miller's farm, lot 31, Greenwood. These wells are all nearly completed, and barring accidents, should all be finished this week.

The Mutual Company's well on G. Pease's farm, lot 29, Greenwood, was finished this week Monday, and is a splendid gasser.
The Torrey Oil Company's well on the Wagner farm in Wellsville village is drilled through the third sand and is dry.
