Buttons labeled "Harrison and Success" have appeared in large numbers throughout the State of Indiana.

It is a pleasure to know that some of the statisticians of the country will quit frolic with presidential delegates now and begin tabulating on base ball.

Richard P. Bland, of Missouri, the great silver advocate, has consented to become a candidate for the presidency. The next problem will be to get himself nominated.

After reading the various reports as to his attitude toward the third-term movement, Mr. Cleveland must be in a real quandary as to whether he is a candidate or not.

After two days' debate the House by a vote of 160 to 58 passed the "Filled-Chees" bill taxing manufacturers of the stuff one cent a pound and requiring manufacturers and dealers to pay a license.

The bill to regulate horseshoeing has been signed by the Governor and is now a law. It provides that in cities of 50,000 population or more that all horseshoers shall pass an examination and be registered in the County Clerk's office.

"It looks very much as if the long vexed question in the Methodist Episcopal church would be finally settled this year," says a writer in the *New York Mail and Express*, "and women would be admitted as lay delegates to all of its conferences and such other positions as can be filled by a lay representative.

Rev. Joseph E. Eben Powell, who was indicted at Findlay, O., in January, for false registration, was convicted last week. He is a native of England, and registered and voted without being naturalized. The act was done with the intention, he himself stated, of showing that the election laws in the United States are not enforced. He knows better now.

The murderer Holmes recently sold his "confession" for a large sum to a New York newspaper. He confessed to having murdered somewhere in the neighborhood of 27 persons, some of whom have since been found to be alive. A few days after writing the confession the murderer was baptised by a priest and admitted to the Roman Catholic faith. He should now make another confession stating that his first document was a lie. But then, perhaps there was an excuse for it. The newspaper that bought it would probably not be satisfied with anything short of the number of murders he plead guilty of.

On the summit of a high hill in central Potter county are four springs so near together that a person may carry water in the hollow of his hand from any one them and drop some of it into the three. In one of these springs the Allegany river has its source. Another is the fountain head of the Genesee river. In the third the Sinaemahoning branch of the Susquehanna rises and flows west and south to the main stream. The fourth spring sends forth the Pine Creek branch of the Susquehanna which flows east and south to the main stream. Thus waters starting on a North Pennsylvania hill, within a stone's throw of each other, separate at last so widely that those from one spring have their outlet in the Gulf of Mexico, those from another mingle with the tide of the Gulf of St. Law-

rence, while those of the other two reunite again in the Chesapeake bay. It is doubtful if there is another such watershed on this continent as that Pennsylvania upland.

The opponents of free silver in the Democratic party have been slow to recognize the fact that their enemies have good prospects of securing control of the Chicago convention. To the gold standard man of the East, the proposition for the free and unlimited coinage of silver at the ratio of 16 to 1 without waiting for the cooperation of other nations, has seemed so visionary that he could not believe it would muster serious strength in a national convention. Now that the work of selecting delegates is at hand, he begins to realize his mistake. The Administration Democrats are thoroughly anxious over the outlook, for unless aggressive work is put forth within the next few weeks the convention will be controlled by the radical free silver wing of the party, which will not even listen to suggestions of compromise.

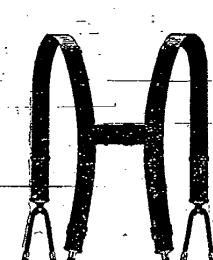
