How well qualified Mr. Robbins may be in parliamentary usages and tactics is not in evidence. but certainly no man in the past two sessions of the lower branch of the legislature has enjoyed a greater reputation for rugged honesty than he, and no man in that body has taken a more pronounced stand in fighting questionable legislation. These facts ought to give Mr. Robbins a strong lead in a contest for the responsible position of presiding officer of the assembly.-Olean Times.
