NEAR-BY NEWS.

A Few Outside Happenings in Which Our Readers Will Be Interested.

The Democratic county convention will meet at Belmont this week Saturday.

Judge Norton is at Warsaw this week holding the term of court for that county.

A. B. Cottrell has purchased the hardware business of Burdick & Green at Alfred, and taken possession.

A census at Willard State Hospital last week showed 2,104 inmates, the lowest number in the institution in several years.

The members of Hornellsville's ball team receive salaries aggregating \$1,000 per month. Doubtless somebody will have to put up some cash.

Charles H. Seaver, a student at Middlebury Academy, has the highest number of Regents' counts of any academic student in the State, it is said. He is only 15 years of age and has 105 counts.

The city of Johnstown, Pa., which was overwhelmed by the waters of a broken dam May 31st, 1889, engulfing several thousand people, is now a handsome and thriving place of 40,000 inhabitants, having added 10,000 to its population since that calamity.

It has been suggested that the college men of Allegany county take steps towards the formation of an Allegany County College Men's Association. For the purpose of more thoroughly discussing the question, a meeting has been called at Wellsville for Thursday, June 18th.

A. J. Hardee of Wayland has a watch which is 23 1/2 years old. The solid silver cases, bowl shaped, and the silver dial and minute and hour hands are handsomely engraved. The dial also has a quadrant. Under the dial is the name Augustus, and the date 1853. The watch was made at Amsterdam by Woudenburg. It is nearly one and a half inches thick.

It was 45 years ago that the first Erie train ran into Dunkirk from New York. It carried among other notables, Daniel Webster, President Fillmore and Secretary of State Seward. Mr. C. H. Sherman of Dunkirk, was the engineer, who was at the throttle of the engine which drew the train. He is now 77 years of age, but is still in the employ of the Erie railroad, being foreman at the Dunkirk round house.

Two thousand dollars have been raised in Belmont to put down an oil well on the Parker Leilus farm, two miles east of the village. Wm. Robinson, who is a spiritualist, claims that he has had direct communication from the spirit world, and that persons there, who when on earth were considered good judges in matters pertaining to oil, have indicated to him exactly where the well should be located. Twenty years ago, within a hundred rods of this same spot a test well was put down which yielded both oil and gas in small quantities. There were, however, at that time no such facilities for shutting off the salt water which continually filled the well, as at the present, and as neither oil nor gas was produced in paying quantities, the well was shortly abandoned and the matter has been almost entirely forgotten until recalled by the present excitement. Some of the leading spirits in the community have contributed large sums of money toward the fund raised for carrying on the work.

Speaking about last week's storms, the Belmont Dispatch says: "The old adage that every June has its flood seldom if ever proves untrue. This year it came on the 9th of the month and for a time things looked serious and they were so. Phillip's Creek raised four feet in almost as many minutes. The logs in the yard of Davis & Bissett were floated down against the boom above the dam and formed a jam several logs deep, covering a couple of acres and mixed in with about a mile of stump fence. On the river ride a temporary boom gave way and fully 25,000 feet of hemlock logs went over the dam and many of them will, no doubt, bring up in Lake Ontario, never to return. The Erie's tracks were flooded at the mouth of Plumb Bottom creek delaying trains from three to five hours.
