SEVERE IN BURIAL

The body of an unknown man found in a creek in Elm Valley.

The lifeless body of a good looking, well dressed young man was found under Erie Railroad bridge No. 8, at Elm Valley, about half past nine o'clock on Tuesday morning, by trackwalker Patrick Gallagher, of this village. Coroner

and at eleven o'clock had removed the body to the barn of Erastus B. Leonard, where it remained until after the inquest, when it was brought to this village, and deposited in Fowler's undertaking rooms, waiting identification. It would seem that the man committed suicide by thrusting a sharp instrument, probably a tool used in his trade, through his heart, before falling into the creek. The verdict of the coroner's jury, in accordance with the above facts, was that he "came to his death by a puncture wound through the heart."

The dead man was a robust, six-foot fellow, between 25 and 28 years of age, with no superfluous flesh, yet weighing probably 180 pounds. He had a full face, recently clean shaven, and his appearance would indicate him to have been in perfect health. His clothes were good ones, such as a prosperous laboring man would wear.

LATER.—A telegram has been received from Ludlow, Pa., saying that the description given of the man answers to the description of Harry E. Norlin of that place, and that his father would be here on Thursday.

STILL LATER.—Henry Norlin, the father of the young man, accompanied by another son, arrived early Thursday forenoon, driving from Wellsville, and recognized the corpse as his son. They are Swedes, and Harry is a carrier by trade, last working at Great Bend, Pa., from which place he wrote home last Thursday. The father and son left on No. 29 with the corpse, for Kane, Pa., where the body will be buried.
