The arrangements for the 30th encampment of the G. A. R. at St. Paul, Minn., are almost completed. Letters thus far received warrant the estimate that not less than 30,000 veterans will be in line on the day of parade.

It is announced that Earl Li Hung Chang, Special Ambassador from the Emperor of China, will arrive in New York by the steamship St. Louis next Friday. Arrangements have been made by President Cleveland to escort him with a detachment of the Sixth Regiment United States Cavalry to the Waldorf Hotel, where he will remain during his stay in New York as the guest of the nation.

A statue of John Brown was recently unveiled at North Elba, N. Y., near where he is buried. After Mr. Brown's execution, through the efforts of Kate Field, his farm was purchased by an association, which turned it over to the state last January, and is now cared for by the Forestry Commission. It is proposed to bring Miss Field's body from Honolulu and inter it in front of the monument.

A veteran handed us the following bit of law, and asked us to publish it: Any person who shall willfully wear the badge of the Grand Army of the Republic, or who shall use or wear the same to obtain aid or assistance thereby within the state of New York, unless he shall be entitled to use or wear the same under the rules and regulations of the Department of New York, Grand Army of the Republic, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be punished by imprisonment for a term not to exceed thirty days, or a fine not to exceed twenty dollars, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
