Compared to the political puzzle of 1896, the "Pigs in the Clover" puzzle of some years ago was too easy.

Mrs. Mary Elizabeth Lease, the noted female politician of Kansas, who was born and raised in McKean county, Pa., recently visited her early home and delivered two speeches in Bradford.

The first state election held this fall was that of Vermont, which occurred on Tuesday of last week, resulting in the choice of Josiah Grout, Republican candidate for Governor, by 29,093 majority.

At the late National G. A. R. Encampment at St. Paul, Minn., last week, Major Thaddeus S. Clarkson, of Omaha, was elected Commander-in-Chief; Gen. J. H. Mullen, of Minnesota, Senior Vice; Charles W. Buckley, of Alabama, Junior Vice; Gen. A. E. Johnson, Surgeon, and Rev. Mark D. Taylor, of Massachusetts, Chaplain. It was voted that the next Encampment be held at Buffalo.

The Convention of the Women's Relief Corps, which met at St. Paul, Minnesota, at the same time of that of the National G. A. R. Encampment, elected the following officers: President, Mrs. Agnes Hitt, of Indianapolis; Senior Vice President, Marie Hazen Winkel, of St. Paul; Treasurer, Mrs. Isabella Bagley, of Zanesville, O.; Junior Vice President, Mrs. Amelia J. Colgan, of Virginia. The recommendation in the President's report that Andersonville prison site be purchased and kept permanently in condition as a war exhibit, was adopted.
