The engineer catches the bag from his cab when the train is running at full speed."

The following are the dates fixed by the election law for the registration of voters: In cities or villages having 5,000 inhabitants or more, the days are four—Oct. 9th, 10th, 16th and 17th. In rural districts there will be two days for registration—Oct. 10th and 17th. These dates should be kept in mind, as too much depends on full registration to permit any carelessness in regard to the matter.

Allegany county's total state tax this year will be \$36,745. The total of the aggregate equalized valuations, upon which the tax of 2.69 mills is levied, is \$4,368,712,903. The total of the state tax is made up of .93 mills levied for school purposes, .75 mills for canal and general purposes, and one mill for state care of insane, and the amount to be collected under the assessments are respectively \$4,062,903, \$3,320,221 and \$4,368,712.

A new labor law which recently went into effect forbids mercantile establishments giving employment to a child under fourteen years of age, nor shall any male under sixteen or female under twenty-one work in any such establishment at the rate of more than ten hours a day or sixty hours a week, and they shall not start work before 7 in the morning nor work later than 10 o'clock at night. Overtime work, however, is to be allowed during the Christmas holidays.
