LOCUSTS IN ARGENTINA

Vast Amount of Destruction Wrought by the Pests.

Panama, Nov. 23.—The invasion of locusts in the interior of Argentina is the most formidable since 1851. In passing over Paysandu they clouded the sky for several hours.
