> The Meaning of It. Very often we give the wrong meaning to i a word and thereby make serious mistakes. For instance, the true and literal meaning of the word rheumatism is "aches or pains o' the muscles, bones and joints of the human | body." It is general and not specific. Also the word relief does not mean cure. Relief may be but a short cessation of pain. 


