

DISTINCTLY FELT IN ANDOVER.

Explosion of 600 Quarts of Nitro-Glycerine -Not more than a Pound of the Man's Flesh Can be Found-Horses and Wagon also Disappeared.

(From the Wellsville Reporter.)

Nothing more than a few morsels of flesh can be found of H. H. Youngs, shattered by the first catastrophe. the Rock Glycerine Co.'s oil well shoot. W. Fassett had repeatedly warned Mr. He met this dreadful death by the explosion of 600 quarts of nitro glyce rine. While loading his wagon from the magazine on the Fassett farm at same. No move to do so was made. 9:15 o'clock this morning [Monday, So on last Saturday Mr. Fassett swore March 22d], the whole quantity of the deadly stuff in wagon and magazine taken before Justice Torrey. On his exploded with terrific force and killed solemn oath to remove the glycerine Youngs and his horses. Diligent elsewhere and not store the same again search for several hours after the catastrophe was unrewarded by any discov- This week he was to move the magaery of Youngs' remains other than some bits of flesh.

Pieces of the horses were found, and twisted irons from the wagon were thrown far away. Scraps of clothing, an inch or so across, a twisted pants' button, and a shred of the unfortanate man's body were picked up by the crowd that soon gathered, but nothing like enough of human remains for decent burial.
