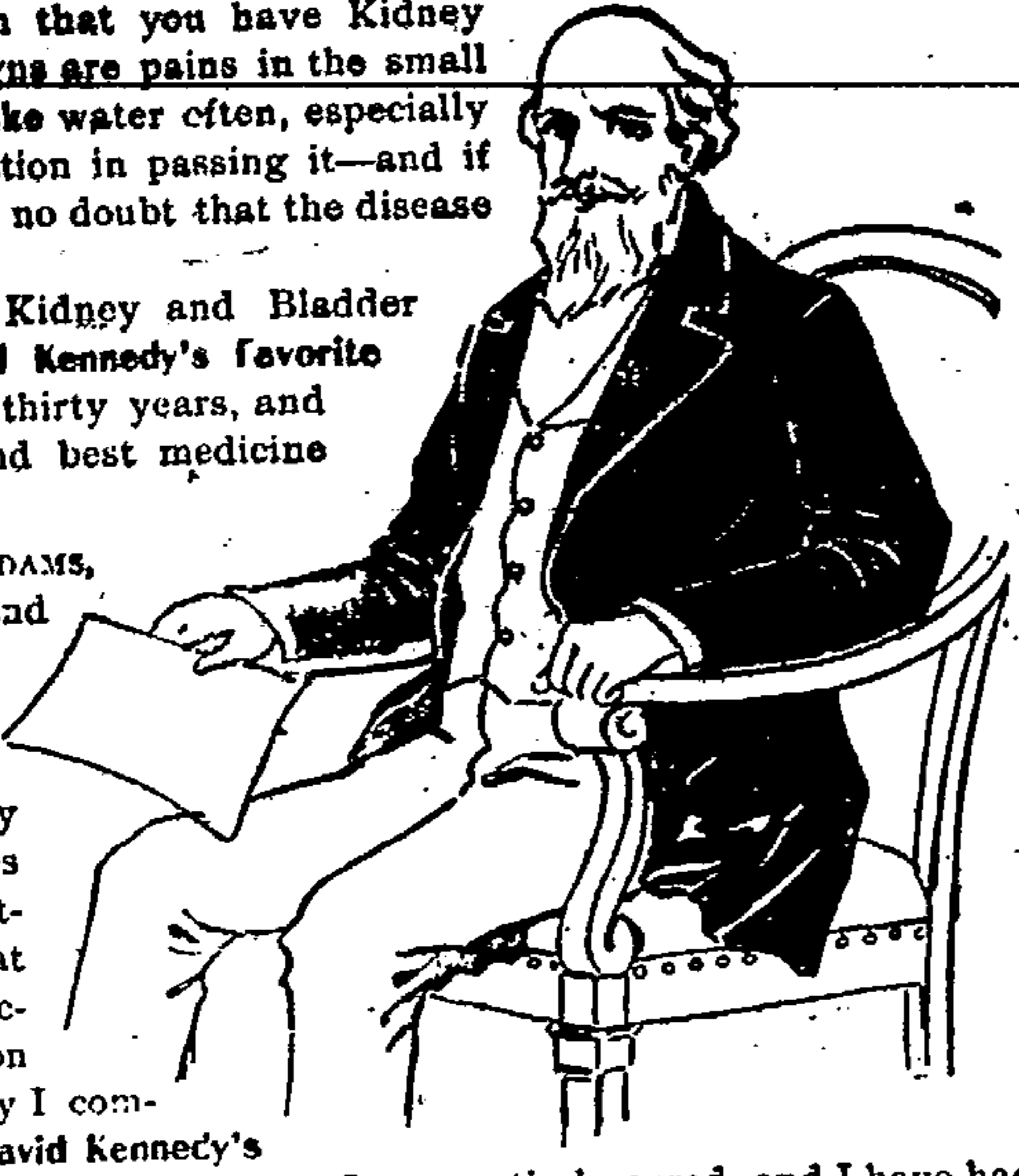

The household goods of Rufus Sawyer, enroute from Wellsville to Hornellsville where he will have charge of the Carr boarding house, were badly damaged in the Erie wreck at Tip Top last week.

The late B. D. Danks had a policy in the Equitable Life Assurance Society of \$1,000. Before leaving for camp he made a will leaving this and his other property to Miss Eliza Judd, to whom he expected to be married on his return.—*Wellsville Reporter*.

The state railroad commission is sending out blanks to the trustees of villages and town boards of the various towns in the state, in order that those who desire to make application for the abolition of grade crossings may do so in regular form, as provided now by a state law.

A broken axle on one of the east-bound Erie fast freights caused a bad smash up at Belvidere, Friday morning. Nineteen cars were piled up in the cut just west of the Belvidere station. The freight was California and other fruit, dressed chickens, beer, etc., and some valuable horses which were only slightly injured.

The N. Y. & P. Railroad Company have commenced the construction of a six-mile extension of their line from Oswayo to Millport. The extension is directly west of Oswayo, toward Olean. Millport, which will be the new terminus of the road, is in the heart of a dense lumber district, where there are already 6,000,000 feet of cut lumber.

E. C. Bradley, of the Empire Gas Co., which supplies Wellsville, Bolivar, Allentown, Seio and other Allegany towns with fuel and light, has become within a few years the largest oil producer in the Allegany field. Recently he added 25 barrels a day to his production by the purchase of Ira Shirley's interest in the Hochstetler & Shirley and the East End Oil Co.'s properties. The consideration was \$28,000 cash.

Dr. Ayres, of Richburg, sued Chas Chadwick of that place to recover pay for medical service, and the defense was that the doctor examined the patient through the window.
