THE CURFEW. LAW.

Much inquiry has been made t know in what the curfew law, recently adopted by Hornellsville, Wellsville, and other places, consists. We give below, for the benefit of our readers, the substance of the ordinance.

1st. No person under the age of sixteen years is allowed on the street, after a certain hour in the evening, unless accompanied by a parent, guardian or other person having the legal control or custody of such minor person, or unless the employment such person makes it necessary to be upon the street during the evening

after said designated hour. 26. Nothing, however, in the ordi nance shall be so construed as to authorize the arrest of any such minor person who shall have in his or her possession a written or printed permit, signed by the parent or guardian, with date of day on which it is to be used -ed. This written or printed permit will not protect said minor person
