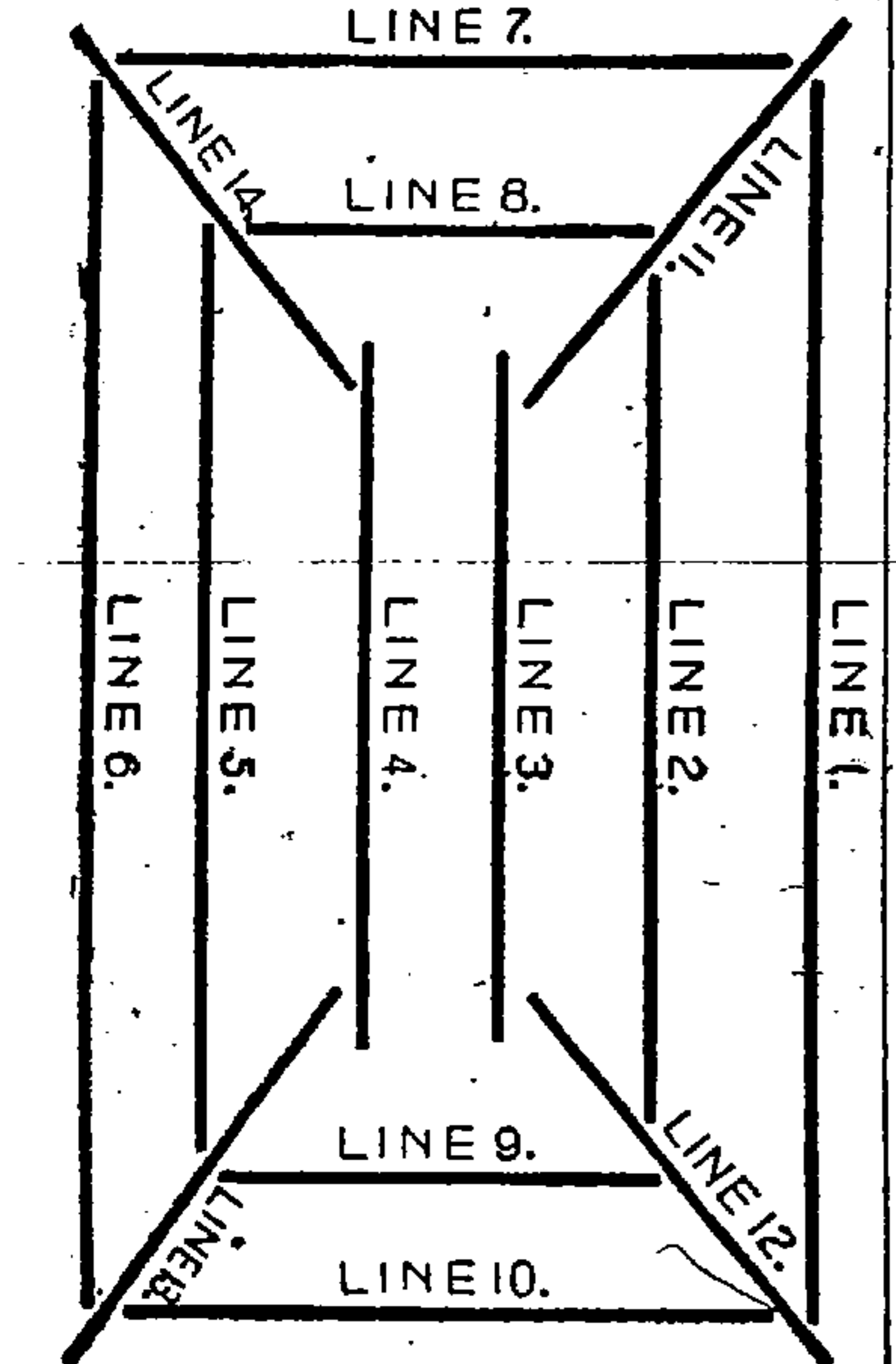



And it never dawned on her that she had called herself an idiot.—Pearson's Weekly.




