For in-<u>tance, two additional votes were given</u> to married men having children, one was given for the possession of a certain amount of property, and two were, given to the graduates of the shigher educational and technical institutions. The result has been to keep the Conservative party in power, though it has undoubtedly a minority of the voters. There has been for some years a vigorous agitation for the repeal of the supplementary vote and the adoption of a policy of "one man, one vote." has led up to the present disturbances.
