

It was thought Russia would recede a point, possibly to gain time. Nevertheless both sides have continued warlike preparation, Japan impressing all her great merchant vessels of the Pacific and Russia pouring more troops into Manchuria. The cry in Russia was against any "pagan invasion of Korea." The new factor of greatest importance. however, was the final ratification of the commercial treaties with China

by the United States and Japan. American consuls were at once in-

structed to proceed to the ports of Mukden and Antung, thus bringing the Russian bear to close quarters with the American eagle in Manchurla. London advices Jan. 18 were that this firm attitude of the United's States, the aggressive tone of the British government and the indifference of France were the prime factors in moving the Russian ministry to let the czar have his way in a policy of conciliation.
